The tomato potato psyllid (TPP), *Bactericera cockerelli*, was detected in Western Australia for the first time in February 2017, prompting a national biosecurity response. TPP is a tiny sap-sucking, winged insect that can significantly impact production, attacking a range of plants in the Solanaceae family including potato, tomato, eggplant, capsicum and chilli.

This information session will provide vegetables growers with the latest information in relation to the detection of TPP, surveillance measures being employed by Agriculture Victoria as well as the industry response and management to TPP from AUSVEG.
