Products to be used:

4FARMERS FLUAZIFOP POST-EMERGENCE SELECTIVE HERBICIDE (63315)
AND OTHER REGISTERED PRODUCTS

Containing: 212 g/L FLUAZIFOP-P PRESENT AS THE BUTYL ESTER as the only active constituent.

Taro (<i>Colocasia</i> spp.) Rakkyo (<i>Allium bakeri</i>) Daikon (<i>Raphanus sativus</i>) Burdock (<i>Arctium lappa</i>) Yam (<i>Dioscorea batatas</i>) Yam bean (<i>Pachyrhizus erosus</i>) Lotus root (<i>Nelumbo</i> spp.) Water chestnuts (<i>Eleocharis dulcis</i>)	Grass weeds, including couch grass and Guinea grass (as listed on product label)	0.5 - 2 L product / ha
Galangal (<i>Alpinia galanga</i>) Turmeric (<i>Curcuma longa</i>)		0.5 - 1 L product / ha

Critical Use Comments:

- Add a wetting agent using recommended rates on the label of the wetting agent product.
- Apply post-emergence of grass weeds.
- Make only one (1) application per crop as a foliar application using a calibrated boom sprayer or equivalent.
- DO NOT use on taro producing leaves for human consumption.

Withholding Periods:

Rakkyo:

DO NOT harvest for 5 WEEKS after application.

Daikon, yam bean, burdock, lotus root, taro, water chestnut:

DO NOT harvest for 7 WEEKS after application.

Galangal, turmeric, yam:

DO NOT harvest for 10 WEEKS after application.

Jurisdiction:

All STATES except VIC.

Note: Victoria is not included in this permit, as their *Control-of-Use* legislation does not require a permit to legalise this off-label use in that state.

Additional Conditions:

This PERMIT provides for the use of a product in a manner other than specified on the approved label of the product. Unless otherwise stated in this permit, the use of the product must be in accordance with instructions on its label.

PERSONS who wish to prepare for use and/or use products for the purposes specified in this permit must read, or have read to them, the DETAILS and CONDITIONS of this permit.

To Avoid Crop Damage

The sensitivity of some species and varieties of the crops to be treated under this permit has not been fully evaluated. It is advisable, therefore, to only treat a small number of plants to ascertain their reaction before treating the whole crop.

Residues & Export of Produce

To allow treated produce to be supplied or otherwise made available for human consumption Maximum Residue Limits (MRLs) have been established for fluazifop-P-butyl covering the commodities listed on this permit. The MRLs apply only to produce marketed and consumed in Australia. If treated produce is to be exported, due account should therefore be taken of the residue definition and residue limits/import tolerances of importing countries and that any residues must not exceed those requirements of the importing country.
