

Crops in order of appearance: Lettuce, Broccoli, Cauliflower, Cabbage, Celery, Tomato, Lebanese cucumber

## What's in the crop?

**Oedema:** Oedema has been reported in broccoli and cabbage. 


**Lettuce:** Lettuce die back (or) lettuce wilt reported. 

**Alternaria:** Alternaria is being reported in **low** levels in brassicas - broccoli, cabbage, cauliflower again - same as last week.

**Plague thrips:** Plague thrips reported on chilli (**low**). It has been reported in Lebanese cucumber seedlings for the past month.

### White blister:

Between Sept-Oct 2021, fluctuating levels of white blister reported in broccoli and cauliflower. No reports of white blister in cabbage.
