

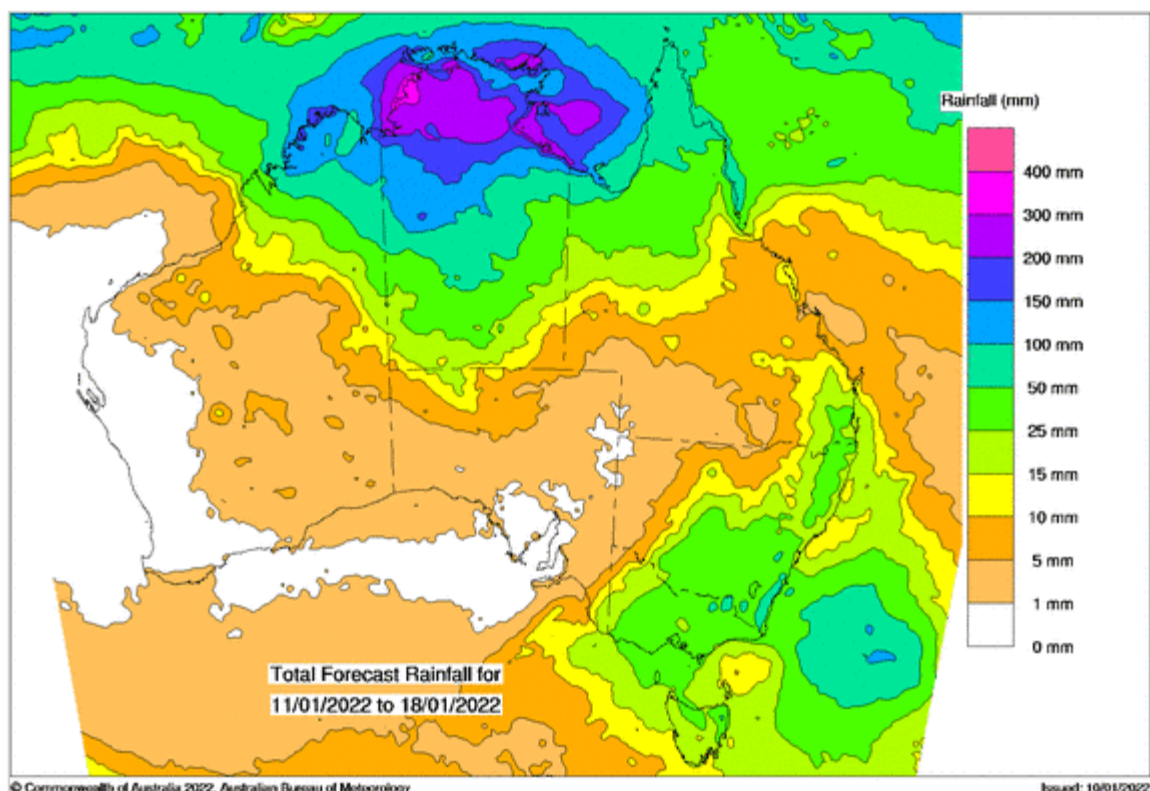
Agriculture alert for Ex-TC Tiffany

Last updated: 1pm, Tuesday, 11 January 2022 (AEDT).

Dot points for distribution through agriculture channels.

Horticulture

- Growers across the Top End have a **good chance of destructive winds and intense, high rainfall**, with conservative estimates of falls up to 100mm per day out to Sunday with isolated falls up to 300mm.
- Growers should note that with the intensive rainfall there is the **potential for significant flooding** especially in areas with already high soil moisture content. These include the Top End, Gregory and Carpentaria districts. Transport routes could be affected.
- **Low to severe intensity heatwave** conditions have been present over the southern Top End, Gregory, western Carpentaria and northern Barkly recently, and maximum temperature have been 6-8C **above** normal for January.
- The arrival of this rain-bearing system will rapidly quench the heatwave conditions, with maximum temperature to swing to 6-8C **below** normal for January.
- **Cold, wet windy conditions may persist for many days**, easing later this weekend.
- Conditions are being driven by ex-tropical cyclone Tiffany which is expected to redevelop into a tropical cyclone and intensify as it continues west to the NT coast, making landfall on Wednesday.
