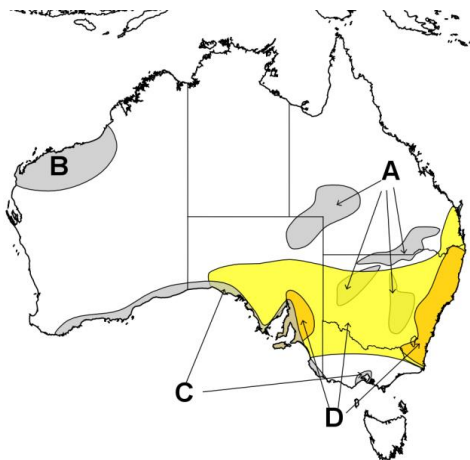




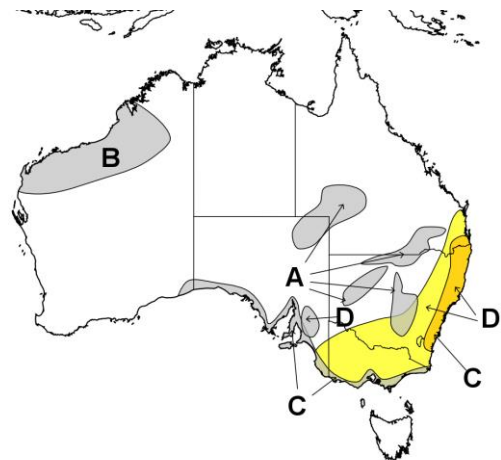
Four-day hazard risk summary for the Australian community:

- D: Damaging Winds

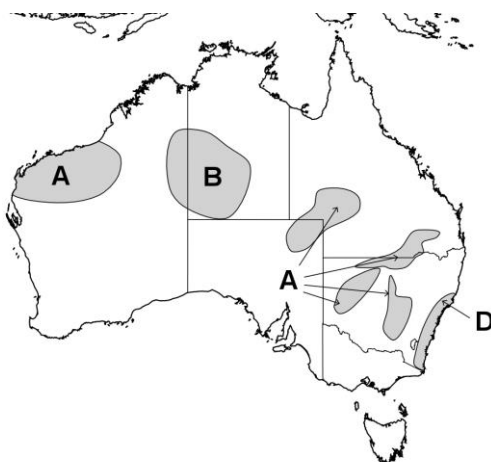

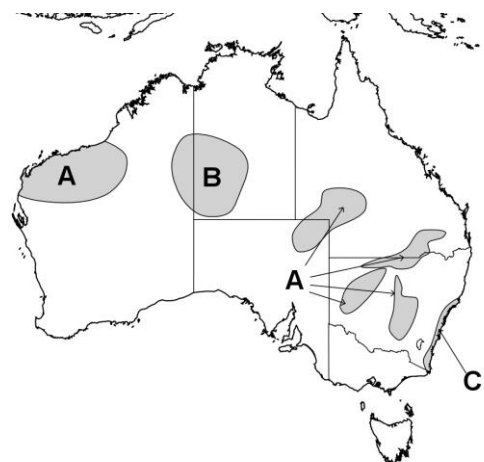

Extended hazard risk outlook: Friday 3 June to Sunday 5 June

- Winds are expected to ease as the low pressure system moves east, but flood impacts in the south and southeastern states as well as the Pilbara may continue.
- Another cold front with possible moderate rainfall will approach SW WA and southern SA.

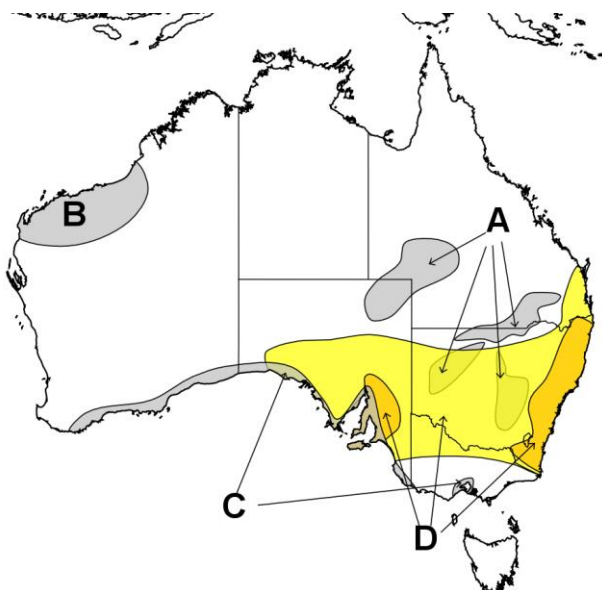

- Increased demand for emergency services

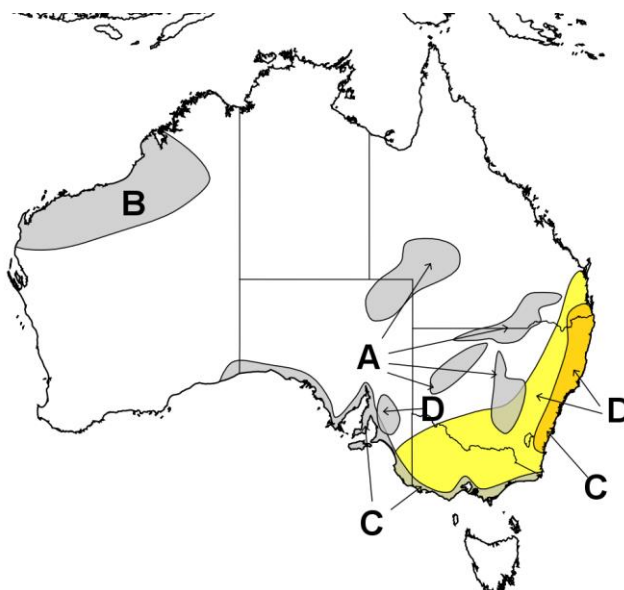
C: Damaging Surf

- Some danger to life.
- Localised coastal erosion.
- Risk of flooding around Port Phillip Bay with disruption to daily activities and minor damage.

D: Damaging Winds

- *Orange*: Higher populations, elevated terrain and exposed areas, with high demand for emergency services and more widespread damage.
- Some danger to life, with some localised incidents of trees and powerlines down.
- Increased demand for emergency services.
- Airport and transport disruptions.
- Widespread risk to cattle/sheep and grazing.

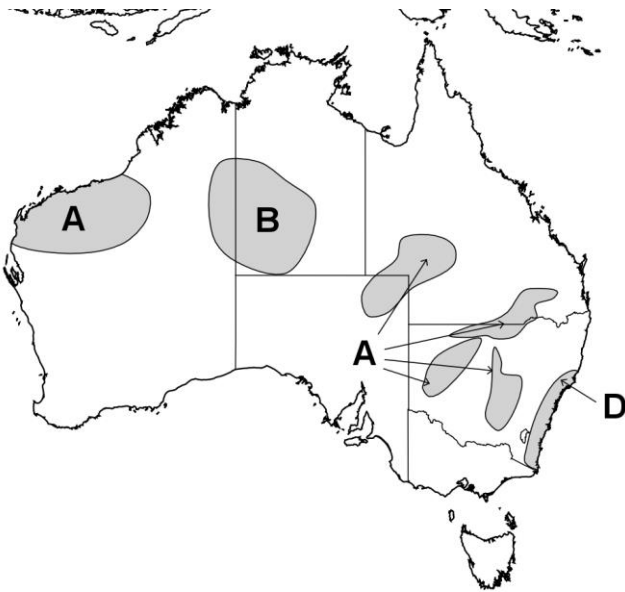

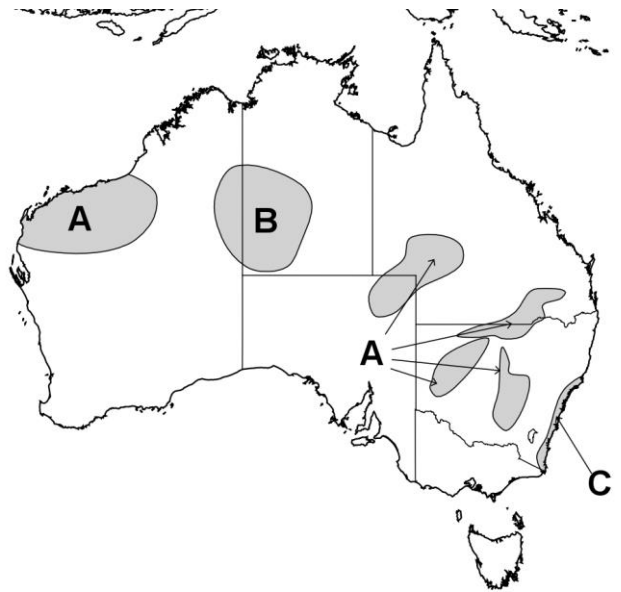
