Contact your legal representative and insurance company. 5. Preserve the scene where practicable.	1. Know the signs and symptoms of an emerging or worsening mental health problem. 2. Approach the person. 3. Listen non-judgementally and use I statements e.g. 'I have noticed', and 'I feel concerned about' etc. 4. Give support and connect them to immediate help services. 5. Encourage professional help, self-help, and other support. Suicide 1. Assess the urgency of suicide by asking them direct questions. 2. If yes, do not leave them alone. 3. Link them to professional help services such as Lifeline at 13 11 14, available 24/7. 4. In an emergency call 000.	Fire 1. Evacuate the area. 2. Notify the Rural Fire Service. 3. Attend to any first aid. 4. If safe and aware of the fire source, put out the fire with an extinguisher or fire blanket. Flood 1. During heavy rain events, listen to local radio for warnings and advice. 2. Lookout for fallen trees or powerlines. 3. Stay away from electrical signs, streetlights, cables, or conductive material. 4. Call SES on 13 25 00 in case of emergency. 5. Do not touch switch boards if they have been damaged by water. 6. Contact your insurance company if property is damaged.	1. Do not touch anyone receiving an electric shock. 2. Using a non-conductive item (e.g. wooden broom stick) turn off power from the source. 3. Call 000. 4. Administer first aid. Fallen Power Pole In the case of fallen power lines, call 000 immediately and do not touch any persons receiving a shock. Notify the police and electricity entity. Keep away from the area. Do not attempt to rescue persons until the powerlines have been de-energised.	1. Refer to labels and safety data sheets. 2. Raise the alarm. 3. Wear the correct Personal Protective Equipment. 4. Control the spill. 5. Contain the spill. 6. Clean up. 7. Attend to any first aid needs. 8. Call 000 for medical attention if needed.
